

It's BIG BAND time again !

Chris Achenbach and the Borders Big Band make their second visit to Balerno Music Festival following the stunning success of their debut Festival concert in 2015, but this time they're the Gala Concert stars.

Big Bands harks back to the swing era of the '30s and '40, which in turn was rooted in the popularity of jazz in the '20's. The danceable swing style of big bands and bandleaders such as Benny Goodman was the dominant form of American popular music from 1935 to 1946, a period known as the swing era.

Originally formed in 1978 by enthusiastic amateur musicians who wanted to revive and promote the swing classics of the 1930s and 40s big band era, Borders Big Band is a high energy 15 piece ensemble which performs all over the Borders, Edinburgh and the Lothians, Fife and the North of England. It draws its repertoire from the libraries of the 'greats' including Count Basie, Duke Ellington, Benny Goodman, Glenn Miller, Bufddy Rich and many more.


Chris Achenbach has been Musical Director of the Band since 1983, and as well as being classically trained in piano, he is a jazz pianist and also Director of Music at Holy Trinity Church, Melrose. As the day job he is principal of Millside Music, a leading provider of Music Therapy, and he will be talking at the Festival about that aspect of his work at the Dinner Discussion on 28 September.

Last year's Borders Big Band concert was such a success that we had to have the Band back for a return visit, and we know that this year's will be a memorable Balerno Music Festival Gala Concert.

Fiona Gilroy, Chair of the Festival Society, said of the donations;


